

**A ORDINANCE BY
COUNCILMEMBER H. LAMAR WILLIS**

AS SUBSTITUTED BY PUBLIC SAFETY AND LEGAL ADMINISTRATION

AN ORDINANCE TO WAIVE THE PROVISIONS OF CHAPTER 10, ARTICLE II, SECTION 10-209 (c) AND (d) OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF ATLANTA, GEORGIA SO AS TO MODIFY THE HOURS OF OPERATION ON JULY 5, 2004 ONLY, FOR ALL LICENSED ESTABLISHMENTS AUTHORIZED TO SELL ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES FOR ON PREMISES CONSUMPTION; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

WHEREAS, the public holiday, July 4th, 2004, falls on a Sunday this year.

WHEREAS, the Atlanta Code of Ordinances only allows for alcohol to be sold on Independence Day in stadiums or coliseums and restaurants if it falls on a Sunday.

WHEREAS, local licensed alcohol establishments would like to provide entertainment and Independence Day festivities to the citizens of Atlanta this year.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ATLANTA, GEORGIA as follows:

SECTION 1.

The provisions of Section 10-209 (c) and (d) of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Atlanta, Georgia are hereby waived in part in this instance only, for the sole purpose of allowing all establishments licensed to engage in the sale of alcoholic beverages for which they are appropriately licensed for on premises consumption, to engage in the sale of alcoholic beverages between the hours of 12:01 a.m., Monday, July 5, 2004 and 2:30 a.m., Monday, July 5, 2004.

SECTION 2.

All licensed premises described in Section 1 above shall be required to be closed to the public and the premises cleared of patrons within thirty minutes after the 2:30 a.m. time set for discontinuance of the sale of alcoholic beverages on the premises on Monday, July 5, 2004.

SECTION 3.

All code sections, ordinances, and parts of code sections and ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby waived for the sole purpose of this ordinance only and shall otherwise remain in full force and effect.

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND CHAPTER 10, ARTICLE II, DIVISION, 5, SECTIONS 10-209(C)(2), (D)(2), (E)(3), AND (F)(4) GOVERNING THE OPERATIONAL HOURS OF ESTABLISHMENTS USED FOR ON-PREMISES ALCOHOL CONSUMPTION SO THAT LICENSED ALCOHOL ESTABLISHMENTS MAY BE ABLE TO OPERATE ON INDEPENDENCE DAY WHEN IT FALLS ON A SUNDAY.

WHEREAS, July 4th, 2004 falls on a Sunday this year.

WHEREAS, the Atlanta Code of Ordinances only allows for alcohol to be sold on Independence Day in stadiums or coliseums if it falls on a Sunday.

WHEREAS, local licensed alcohol establishments would like to provide entertainment and Independence Day festivities to the citizens of Atlanta this year.

SECTION 1

That Sections 10-209(c)(2); (d)(2); (e)(3) and (f)(4) which currently state:

Anytime Independence Day falls on a Sunday, beer and wine (distilled spirits) may be sold by the drink for consumption on the premises between the hours of 12:30 p.m. of that particular Sunday, to 2:30 a.m. Monday, the next day, only in public stadiums, coliseums and auditoriums with a seating capacity in excess of 3,500 persons; and in restaurants (as defined in Code section 10-1.

are amended by deleting said subsections and substituting in lieu thereof the following:

Anytime Independence Day falls on a Sunday, beer and wine (distilled spirits) may be sold by the drink for consumption on the premises between the hours of 12:30 p.m. of that particular Sunday, to 2:30 a.m. Monday, the next day **in licensed alcohol establishments.**

SECTION 2

All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with this ordinance are hereby repealed.

SECTION 3

This amendments reflected in this ordinance shall become effective upon the Mayor's signature.
